Roosevelt and the Land of America* (2016); *The Quiet World: Saving Alaska's Wilderness Kingdom* (2011); and *Rosa Parks: A Life* (2000) among other books.

His lecture is drawn from his book in progress, *Silent Spring Revolution: Rachel Carson, John Kennedy and the Dawn of the Sixties Environmental Movement*. He received his PhD from Georgetown University in U.S. History in 1989. He is a history commentator for CNN and serves as an editor of Audubon Magazine.
